Adults

Global Strategy Group conducted a survey between **November 15 – November 28, 2023,** among 1,000 adults in each of the following countries: **the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Austria, Germany, Poland, Hungary, and Romania.**





Margin of Error

The margin of error at the 95% confidence level is +/- 3.1%.

The margin of error on sub-samples is greater.



Key Findings

- Critical gaps exist across countries when it comes to detailed knowledge about basic Holocaust facts, though baseline Holocaust awareness is generally high across most countries surveyed.
 - Over 1-in-5 French adults say that they had not heard or weren't sure if they had heard of the Shoah prior to taking the survey.
 - A notable portion of younger adults ages 18-29 had not heard of the Holocaust in France (46%), Romania (15%), Austria (14%), Germany (12%).
- Across countries surveyed, large swaths of the population do not know that 6 million Jews were killed during the Holocaust, and notable subsets of the populations believe 2 million or fewer Jews were killed.
 - Participants who believe that 2 million or fewer Jews were killed include 28% in Romania, 27% in Hungary, 24% in Poland, 21% in France, the U.S. and Austria, 20% in the U.K., and 18% in Germany.
- While familiarity with concentration camps and ghettos is more prevalent in Europe, there is a significant knowledge gap among Americans.
 - Approximately half of Americans and one-quarter of adults in the U.K., France, and Romania cannot name a single concentration camp or ghetto.
- Across countries surveyed, 18-29 year olds are more likely to believe that the number of Jews killed during the Holocaust has been exaggerated.
 - A shocking majority (53%) of Romanians ages 18-29 believe the number of Jews killed during the Holocaust has been exaggerated, as do one-third
 of 18-29-year-olds in France.
- · Across countries, most adults believe Hitler and high-ranking Nazis committed most of the crimes against Jews.
- · A majority of adults across almost all countries surveyed believe something like the Holocaust could happen again today.
 - In the U.S., more than two-thirds (76%) of all adults surveyed believe something like the Holocaust could happen again today. This sentiment is echoed in the U.K (69%), France (63%), Austria (62%), Germany (61%), Poland (54%), and Hungary (52%). In Romania, 44% of adults surveyed believe something like the Holocaust could happen again today.
- Positively, there is overwhelming support for Holocaust education across the eight countries surveyed.
 - Across countries, nine-in-ten or more adults believe it is important to continue teaching about the Holocaust, in part so it doesn't happen again.

Have you ever seen or heard the word Holocaust [Shoah] before? [Adults 18-29]






Majorities of the population in nearly all countries surveyed do not know that 6 million Jews were killed during the Holocaust

% Believe 2 million or fewer Jews were killed during the Holocaust






Romanian and French 18-29-year-olds are most likely to not know that 6 million Jews were killed in the Holocaust








Across countries, 18-29-year-olds are more likely to believe that the number of Jews killed during the Holocaust has been exaggerated






Outright Holocaust denial is most prevalent in Romania and France – particularly among 18-29-year-olds




Overall, Americans and Hungarians are most likely to report that Holocaust denial is common in their countries

Holocaust [Shoah] denial refers specifically to any attempt to claim that the Holocaust [Shoah] did not take place. Holocaust [Shoah] denial may include publicly denying or calling into doubt the use of principal mechanisms of destruction (such as gas chambers, mass shooting, starvation, and torture) or the intentionality of the genocide of the Jewish people.




Pluralities of adults in the US, Hungary, France, and Germany report that Holocaust distortion is common in their country

PROMPT: Holocaust [Shoah] distortion refers to intentional efforts to excuse or minimize the impact of the Holocaust [Shoah] or its principal elements, including collaborators and allies of Nazi Germany, the gross minimization of the number of the victims of the Holocaust [Shoah] in contradiction to reliable sources, attempts to blame the Jews for causing their own genocide, statements that cast the Holocaust [Shoah] as a positive historical event, or attempts to blur the responsibility for the establishment of concentration camps and killing centers (death camps), devised and operated by Nazi Germany by putting blame on other nations or ethnic groups.






Nearly half of Polish adults and two thirds of 18-29 year olds encounter Holocaust denial or distortion while on social media










Appendix A: Countries Murdered Jewish People Came From



Over half of U.S. adults incorrectly believe the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Germany; fewer than one quarter know they came from Poland



U.K. adults are divided on whether the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Germany or Poland



French adults are divided on whether the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Germany or Poland



A plurality of Austrian adults incorrectly believe the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Germany; fewer than one quarter know they came from Poland



Half of German adults incorrectly believe the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Germany; fewer than one quarter know they came from Poland



The vast majority of Polish adults know the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Poland



A narrow majority of Hungarian adults know the largest number of Jewish people murdered came from Poland






Appendix B: Concentration Camps or Ghettos Named



Almost half of U.S. adults cannot name a single Nazi camp or ghetto; there is limited familiarity with camps other than Auschwitz



Over one-quarter of U.K. adults overall and one-third of those under 30 years old cannot name a single Nazi camp or ghetto



Over one-quarter of adults in France and nearly half of those under 30 years old cannot name a single Nazi camp or ghetto



Nearly one-in-five Austrians under 30 cannot name a single Nazi camp or ghetto






